- **3. Patriot Pen, Voice of Democracy and Teacher of the Year Banquet** to be held at Post 1285 Winslow, January 20th, 2024. See the attached flyer.
- **4. Change of Post and District Officers**: All District and Post Commanders are reminded that whenever there is change of Officer(s) within the Post or District that they need to FILE NEW ELECTION REPORT and notify the State Adjutant Office ASAP so that the Department directory can be updated accordingly, and the information disseminated to all in the General Orders.
- **5.** The distribution of VFW "Buddy" ® Poppies will be conducted according to the provisions set forth in Sections 711 of the National Bylaws and Manual of Procedure. Department, District, County Council and Post Commanders should arrange now for the distribution of Buddy Poppies for the Memorial Day campaign in their respective
- areas. All profits accruing from the distribution of Buddy Poppies shall be used in accordance with Sections 219 and 704 of the Manual of Procedure.
- **6.** The attention of Department, District, County Council and Post Commanders is directed to Section 103 of the Manual of Procedure, which prescribes the manner in which applications for membership will be handled. Applications for membership of new, reinstated or transfer members must be voted on by the members present at a regular Post meeting.
- 7. Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure: Provides that each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten-dollar (\$10) delegate fee. Posts are encouraged to register their Post delegate online through the Online Membership System (OMS) or by submitting their National Convention Post and Delegate Registration form that was mailed to all Posts as part of the Election Report/Convention Registration mailing that went out in February. Advanced registration for the 124th National Convention should be mailed with each delegate's name and
- address to: Convention Registration, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.
- **8. Section 220 of the National By-Laws, "Vacancies and Removal of Elected Officers or Committee Members" states**: "Any elected Post Officer or committee member removed, by reason of failure to pay current dues or under the provisions of this section shall not be eligible to serve in any Post office or committee in the same administrative year in which the officer or committee member is removed."
- **9. Trustee's Report of Audit:** Post/District are reminded to forward their Trustees' reports at the end of each quarter of current year: June 30, Sep 30; Dec 31 and Mar 31; send these reports as soon as possible after each quarter to the Department Quartermaster.
- **10. Checks Sent to Department of Maine:** When forwarding checks to our State Quartermaster, please note that checks are to be made out to "Department of Maine, VFW" and in the memo line, note the name of the program it is for.
- **11. Candidates for High Office 2023-24**: Any member wishing to run for any high office are to notify the State Adjutant office via e-mail of their intent for publishing in the GOs.
- 12. Convention Book Advertising: Consult Tele-Communications from Londonderry, NH is soliciting ads

for our State Convention book throughout the State of Maine. Any business calling your Post respectively, inquiring about the solicitation, please inform them that they are the sole company that sells ads for the Department of Maine.

- 13. Officers Duties: Article II, Section 218 Officers and Chairman, Duties and Obligations (a) Officers (1) Duties of Commander item (k) "Assure that the Commander or their representative attend all properly called District conventions or meetings." Post Commander must attend District meetings. Failure without just cause to perform these duties may result in removal from office. All Post Senior and Junior Vice Commanders are urged to attend all District meetings planned. The Post Commanders should employ all elected Post Officers and post members to attend District meetings.
- 14. Post Commanders: Sections 219 and 704 of the Manual of Procedure outline the various things for which the Post Relief Fund can be used. Several years ago, the phrase "To foster true patriotism through, historical and education programs," was added to this section. This allows the Post to use the relief funds for the Voice of Democracy program or other Americanism programs that are educational. This does not include Post building projects, hall remodeling, color guard uniforms or any other expenditure that does not follow these guidelines.

- o Sleep disturbances, including insomnia, or sleeping too much.

- o Reduced appetite and weight loss, or increased cravings for food and weight gain.
- o Anxiety, agitation, or restlessness.
- o Slowed thinking, concentrating, making decisions, and remembering things.
- o Feelings of worthlessness or guilt, fixating on past failures, or self-blame.
- o Trouble thinking, concentrating, making decisions, and remembering things.
- o Frequent or recurrent thoughts of death, suicidal thoughts, suicide attempts, or suicide.
- o Unexplained physical problems, such as back pains or headaches.

That makes Six Post and one District that have joined the Commander 100% Club. Will your Post or District be the next to join them?

National Council Member – Maine – I continue to attend zoom meetings for the Fundraising committee I am on. I was selected by the Commander-in-Chief to be the National Representative at the Vermont Council of Administration and the Patriots Pen and Voice of Democracy Banquet. I am very honored to attend their event the weekend after all of ours. I have received many emails on the National Financial status. Lots to take in but part of my duties as a Committee Member.

Legislation – National Headquarters continues to ramp up the pressure on congress to pass the GUARD Act. Our Sams account government contractors has been renewed for another year. Jennifer Lane PSC now has full control of all our grants. Took us a bit to turn over due to State and federal new required documents. Wishing all a productive 2024 and beyond. Reminder to all be sure your post and District are incorporated, Trustee reports in and up to date, 990 are filed, Bonding up to date and insurance. Those with employee's Federal and State Tax's up to date. Finally, anyone holding a position or office in the organization their dues are up to date.

Grants, NVMS Jennifer Lane, PSC

Grants: We have received payment for our State of Maine VSO Grant of an additional \$12,000 and the State of Maine Homeless Veterans Grant of \$5,630.97. Our VA Transportation Grant of \$40,000 is on track and our comrades are being transported by Penquis under this award.

Veterans and Military Support (VMS): Please be advised that the VFW National Headquarters Unmet Needs Program has changed. As of 09/01/2023 the Unmet Needs Program is only able to assist active-duty service members and their families to include activated Guard/Reserves. The financial hardship must be a direct result

of a current deployment/military pay error not the fault of the service member/pending medical discharge due to military related injuries/illnesses received while on active duty. Grant limit has also increase to \$2,500.

Support your local Sport Clips location. Student Veteran Support Grant: These grants focus on supporting the overall student population with the communities that are not affiliated with SVA chapters. Grant awards to Post/Districts/Depts are up to \$500/event and up to two times a year. Military Assistance Program (MAP): Purpose: To provide financial assistance to VFW Posts/Depts. and Auxiliaries who sponsor events with their local military community. These funds are meant to build relationships and provide information on VFW programs and services. Adopt-A-Units are just that. Please refer to the National website for information on programs, applications, promotional items, and FAQ's.

NOTE: ALL VMS donations MUST go through the Program Dashboard found online at vfw.org. National will no longer accept paper check donations and please do not send any to me or the Department QM. IF you need assistance with donations, please contact me.
