- **2.** *Council of Administration:* Meeting will be held on 23 June @ 10:30 am @ Bangor Grand Hotel, Bangor, ME. See attached flyer for hotel and banquet information.
- **3. Proof of Eligibility Requirements for Officers:** All Posts, Districts and Departments should be reminded of the provisions of Sections 216, 416, and 516 of the Manual of Procedure that officers, elected and appointed, shall not be installed, or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted to the respective Adjutant and properly reviewed.
- **4. Installing officers are** directed to see to it that the Post Election Report forms have been completed and submitted to National Headquarters. If a Post Election Report form has not been forwarded to National Headquarters at the time of installation, the installing officer shall complete and forward such report at the time of the installation of Post Officers no later than June 1. We encourage all Post Quartermasters to use **the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS).** Post Election Reports received electronically will be forwarded to the Department Headquarters. Additionally, Section 413 of the National Bylaws requires that a properly completed District Election Report be submitted to National Headquarters prior to the convening of the Department Convention.

- **5.** Attention of Post Commanders is directed to Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure, which provides that each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten-dollar (\$10) delegate fee. Posts are encouraged to register their Post delegate(s) online through the Online Membership System (OMS) or by submitting their National Convention Post and Delegate Registration form that will be mailed to all Posts as part of the Election Report/Convention Registration mailing going out later this month. Registration forms for the 124th National Convention may be mailed to: Convention Registration, 406 W. 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111.
- **6. Section 222 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure** provides that delegates and alternates for the District Convention and meetings, Department and National Conventions shall be elected at a regular meeting in April. Posts are entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each thirty (30) members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Post as of March 31.
- **7. Section 218 of the Manual of Procedure** requires that the Post Commander shall see that the Post Trustees Reports of Audit are properly prepared and submitted each quarter.
- **8. Resolutions:** Posts desiring to submit resolutions for consideration by their District prior to the convening to the State Convention must present the resolution to their District in time for their District Conventions and upon approval by the district, copies of the resolution must reach the Department Adjutant in time to be prepared for the State Convention.
- **9. LOYALTY DAY AND MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCE:** Section 223 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure provides that each Post shall make the necessary arrangements for proper observance of Loyalty Day and Memorial Day. Officers should see that suitable grave markers, wreaths and flags of the United States are placed on the graves of deceased veterans.
- **10. "BUDDY"** ® **POPPIES DISTRIBUTION:** The distribution of VFW "Buddy" ® Poppies will be conducted according to the provisions set forth in Section 711 of the National Bylaws and the Manual of Procedure. The Department, District, County Council and Post Commanders should now arrange for the distribution of Buddy Poppies in their respective areas. In the ongoing effort to provide as much assistance as possible to those serving in the military, we recommend that proceeds or portions from this year's annual poppy distribution be designated for the purpose of providing VFW support to our military. Posts and Departments now have the opportunity to assist qualified military personnel through the VFW Veterans and Military Support Programs. In keeping with the intent of Sections 219(a)(c) and 704(a)(c) of the Manual of Procedure "Relief Fund," this year's poppy campaign can play a direct role in demonstrating to those who are charged with protecting and defending our way of life that we appreciate and value their sacrifice.
- **11. Candidates for High Office 2023-24**: Any member wishing to run for any high office are to notify the State Adjutant office via e-mail of their intent for publishing in the GOs.
- **12. Convention Book Advertising: Consult Tele-Communications from Londonderry, NH** is soliciting ads for our State Convention book throughout the State of Maine. Any business calling your Post respectively, inquiring about the solicitation, please inform them that they are the sole company that sells ads for the Department of Maine.

- **13. Attention of incoming Post Officers is directed to Section 218** of the Manual of Procedure which outlines the duties of various Post Officers.
- 14. Post Commanders: Sections 219 and 704 of the Manual of Procedure outline the various things for which the Post Relief Fund can be used. Several years ago, the phrase "To foster true patriotism through, historical and education programs," was added to this section. This allows the Post to use the relief funds for the Voice of Democracy program or other Americanism programs that are educational. This does not include Post building projects, hall remodeling, color guard uniforms or any other expenditure that does not follow these guidelines.

Everyone is anxious to get outdoors for projects, gardening, fishing, and more. Keep in mind that skin cancer is the most common of all cancers, and it can become deadly. When you are going to be outdoors, use sunscreen. It will provide protection from ultra-violet rays which are there even on cloudy days. A wide brimmed hat is also a good idea. The Center for Disease Control provides the following information regarding sunscreen. Use a sunscreen labeled as "broad spectrum" with an SPF (sun protection factor) of 15 or higher. People with extremely fair skin or a history of skin cancer should probably use a higher SPF number. If you're outside for an extended period, re-apply every 2 hours. If you go swimming or sweat heavily, re-apply. Spring and summer in Maine are truly glorious times. Enjoy being outdoors but use common sense and take care of your skin.

Comrades,

As always, I hope this finds all of you in good health. We are starting to get some good weather. Please get out and enjoy it. Congratulations to Post 9389 Caribou, 11553, 4169 Vinalhaven, 9394 Kittery, and District 1 for meeting or exceeding their goal of 100%, great job by all! Will you Post or District be next?

National Council Member – Maine – Not much going on at the National level. We did have our National Commander-in-Chief visit us for our council meeting and the Commander/Presidents Testimony. It was a good visit, and he was overall pleased with the Department. Most of the month I was working on LD2259 as a National Legislative and Council Member. You will see below that we did some great stuff for our Veterans and their Families.

Legislation – I have remained in contact with all four of our Legislators in Washington DC. I had Senator Kings office send us a letter showing he supported the GUARD VA Benefits Act. Which was used to help us at the State level. The Department Legislative Team with some help worked hard to ensure LD2259 was passed. I am happy to say and very proud that Maine was the third State to pass a law that prevents predatory law firms "Claim Sharks" from taking advantage of Veterans and their Families while filing a VA claim. The Governor signed it into law on 11 April 2024. This was a huge win for Veterans, and I am glad we could make it happen.

Membership – The Department is currently sitting at 97.10% with 6344 Members which is an increase of 1.05% and 699 Members. We need 189 Members to reach 100% and 320 Members to reach 102%. We have decreased our New Members by 6 and increased our Reinstated Members by 64 from this time last year. We have 12 Posts that have completed a Recruiter Event and submitted the proper paperwork to me. We have 19 Post that need 10 or less Members 14 of them need 5 or less Members. Let's close the deal on these Posts and get them over 100%. We must make sure we Retain, Reinstate and Recruit Members. Please read to make sure you understand the 2023-2024 Department and National Membership Program have changed. - **2.** VA Program to help Veterans facing foreclosure On May 31, 2024, VA will launch the Veterans Affairs Servicing Purchase (VASP) program to help more than 40,000 veterans facing foreclosure on their homes. Through VASP, VA will purchase defaulted VA loans from mortgage servicers, modify the loans, and then place them in the VA-owned portfolio as direct loans. This will empower VA to work directly with eligible veterans to adjust their loans and monthly payments so they can keep their homes. Veterans with questions about avoiding foreclosure can contact a VA loan technician by calling 877-827-3702.

53% of Posts in the Department were eligible to vote at the Department Convention last year, this year my goal is 75%, let's all work together to meet that goal! Per National and State By-Laws, to vote at the State Convention you must have turned in all 4 Trustees Reports, 3 of which should have been turned in at this point with the next one due at the end of the Month. Your Post must also have been inspected, your Quartermaster must be Bonded, all monies owed to the Department must be paid. ALL Post and Districts are required to be incorporated, the opportunity to do that opened up January 1st, 2024, make sure you are incorporated and registered with the State of Maine. Check the State Quartermasters hit list in these GOs to ensure you are aware of all these items and where you stand. The Department Adjutant sent out a list of your voting strength on 1 April, your Post is entitled to 1 delegate and 1 alternate per every 30 members in good standing as of March 31st and has paid a registration fee for every delegate.
