Credentials – Steward:

Credentials: We had 29 Posts or Districts present and eligible to vote at the Department Convention, 7 more were eligible to vote but not present, that is 68% eligibility from last year's convention! Per National and State By-Laws, to vote at the State Convention you must have turned in all 4 Trustees Reports; 3 of these trustee reports should have been turned in at this point, June, September, and December 2025. Your Post must also have been inspected, which should have been done at this point. Your Quartermaster must be bonded, and that bonding is due NOW, additionally, all monies owed to the Department must be paid. ALL Post and Districts are required to be incorporated with the State of Maine; this was available to do in January. Posts are entitled to 1 delegate and 1 alternate per every 30 members in good standing as of March 31st, so push to increase your membership this month so you have more voting power at the convention. You can vote as a Post Commander (1 Vote) or on behalf of them if you are a Post Senior or Junior Vice Commander, but you cannot then vote as a Post Delegate if you vote as the Commander. Membership/Legislative/Finance – SanPedro:

Membership: Program: We have 22 of our 39 Posts and 4 of our 10 Districts at 100% or higher! 18 of the 22 Posts and all 4 Districts have exceeded 101%! We have 13 Posts that have completed a Recruiter Event and submitted the proper paperwork to me. We have 9 Posts and 2 District that need 10 or less Members to reach 100%. The Department is at 96.66% with 6028 Members. We need 208 Members to reach 100% and 271 Members to reach 101%. We have some work to do but can reach 100/101% again this year. The Department has slowed down to almost a halt. We can't afford this as we come down the stretch of the VFW year. Post Membership Teams and Leadership have not adjusted their Membership Plans as the Plans have stalled. Posts need to be creative to find ways to sign Members back up and get new ones. Many Posts are not doing anything to try and build their Membership up. We need to continue to move forward with a positive attitude in our efforts towards reaching 100/101% across the board. Post Leadership must be creative with the way they seek Membership. Commanders and Membership Teams need to work those rosters to ensure they have reached all their members. We have to put as much effort into retaining Members as we did sign them up. We need to reach out to those that have expired in the past and try again to get them back. More Recruiting Events need to take place. Bottom line we can't afford to sit back and wait we need to get out there to Recruit and Retain these Members.

Legislative: We had a very successful National VFW Washington Conference in early March 2026. There were 8 VFW and 1 Auxiliary Members that attended. We met with Senator King and Collins in person while Congresswoman Pingree and Congressman Golden staff met with us. We were able to present the VFW Talking Points, Priority Goals and the leave behind QR Code post card. They were very receptive to our Talking Points, and we used stories from Maine Veterans to hammer home these issues. While there the Senate played a political game to appease the VFW and the Legion who were both in town. By calling for a Unanimous Consent Vote to pass the Major Richard Star Act. This looked good to the eye but never was going to pass since they already knew that Senator Ron Johnson from Wisconsin was voting no and killing the vote. It looks like Maine Veterans Homes will be short of the money needed to operate in the green. The Governor did put more money into the budget for them, but it will not cover the loss. LD 182 is still out there but looks like it won't be funded. Follow up with our Legislators on our request for a hearing on the Major Richard Star Act. If this happens, we may get it out of committee and on the floor for a majority vote. We must be ready if Maine Veterans Homes calls on us to help them push their agenda. We must continue to put pressure on our Legislators to hear our concerns and respond to them. We can do this by reaching out to them by email or by the call to action that is sent out. I recommend that more Members sign up for the VFW Action Corp. This will help spread the work of all the things the VFW is doing and other things going on that are important to Veterans. You do not have to be a VFW Member to sign up for it.

Finance: Most individual budgets are within their allotted budget. Quartermaster Williams has stayed on top of our CD, and we are making a lot of money because of it. He has kept me and the Commander informed and has done a great job keeping the Department in good order. At this time, we are operating in the black and it will get

better once a few grants come in. This is normal as we wait for the State to send us monies for the gaming grants authorized to us. This budget is very tight, and we must stay focused on staying within our individual budgets. Continue to keep doing what we are doing. Each Chairman and budget owner must work hard to stay within their allotted budget. It is our duty to be good stewards of the Departments monies.

B. The New 24-bed Substance Abuse Unit is holding a ribbon cutting ceremony on 25 April and they to do a virtual tour in the future. They plan on taking veterans on 04 May.

C. Veterans' access to BLDG 248 R.O. and Bldg. 205 entrances are open.
